

# Possibly deeper than 1993

2008 may replace 1993 as the benchmark year for flooding in the area after the city received a report on Monday that the Iowa River may crest at 32 feet by Sunday. The crest in 1993 was 29 feet.

City leaders met on Monday with area emergency personnel, representatives from the fire department, city employees, the police and sheriff departments, county officials, area contractors and business owners to make preliminary plans for the river's crest.

Mayor Dan Wilson emphasized that the city's number one priority is the city water plant, and he stated that sand is now being delivered to the levee and Hwy 92 bypass to build up these areas. "We do have a few days' notice to prepare," said Wilson, "and we will do everything we can to handle this situation."

Area business owners who may be in the flood area have been contacted to make plans to move equipment and other items in the event that their locations receive flood waters. "It's always better to overprepare than to underprepare," said Wilson.

On Monday the water level at the reservoir in Coralville was only inches from overflowing. As this water comes our way, along with the heavy rains received in northern Iowa, the community may very well see record flood levels. "Thirty-two feet could put water over the road at Casey's," said Wilson, and in preparation the Day Care Center announced that they will be closed on Thursday and Friday. Wilson stated that the situation will be monitored, and anyone who may be affected will be contacted. Area volunteers began removing items from the fairgrounds on Monday evening in preparation for the rising waters.

A funnel cloud was spotted southwest of town on Sunday evening, but no reports of its touching down were made. A funnel cloud was reported on the five mile lane near Wapello Sunday evening.
