## Louisa **County Code** Red update

Louisa County will be using the CodeRED Emergency Notification System on March 19, 2012 to call the entire county. This call will give Louisa County personnel the chance to operate the system as if there has been a community wide disaster.

The calls will start in the late morning and will continue until the entire database has been attempted. The message will direct recipients to the county web site to add additional contact numbers, and it also asks that recipients spread the word by mentioning the system to family, friends and neighbors.

Staci Griffin, the Louisa County Emergency Management Coordinator, suggests that, "All individuals and businesses should take the time to visit our website and add contact information to include cellular phones and other non-traditional phones as well as email and text addresses. If your contact information is not in the database you will not receive a call when an urgent message is sent."

Business should register, as well as individuals who have unlisted phone numbers anyone who has changed their phone number recently, and those who use a cellular phone exclusively or have VoIP phones (such as Vonage) as their primary numbers.

Griffin urges citizens to log onto the Louisa County website at www.louisacountyiowa.org and follow the CodeRED link on the right hand side of the page. Those without Internet access may call 319-750-1128 Monday through Friday from 9am to 4pm. Required information includes a physical street address for location purposes and a primary phone number. Additional phone numbers, email and text addresses may also be entered.

## **Extension donates \$10,000 to Youth Center**



The Louisa County Council for ISU Extension & Outreach has donated \$10,000 toward the Extension/ Fair Office that will be located in the new Youth Center at the Louisa County Fairgrounds outside of Columbus Junction. The 7,680 square foot planned Youth Center will be a multi-use facility featuring a meeting hall, offices, kitchen, a covered patio, and restrooms with showers. The building will be used year round for Fair Board meetings, Extension activities and community events. Extension Council Chair Terri Slater says, "This is an exciting opportunity for us to partner with the Fair Board on

the offices we use during the fair and on a space that will be the location of many 4-H and Extension activities for years to come."

Louisa County has almost two hundred 4-H members participating in twelve clubs. Their presence is most visible during the county fair held annually in July, however 4-H clubs and their members are active throughout the year learning new skills and participating in community service activities. In January the clubs joined together with the Louisa County Extension Council and the Fair Board to hold a very successful fundraiser for the youth Center. The soup supper and dessert auction raised \$7,590 for the new facility.

# County Law Enforcement to participate in sTEP Program

Don't Press Your Luck- Drive Sober and Remember to Buckle Up

The Iowa Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau is announcing that the Louisa County Sheriff's Office and an additional 250 law enforcement

agencies from around the state will be on the roads beginning March 15<sup>th</sup> and through March 18th for this year's second special Traffic Enforcement Program (sTEP) wave. They will be looking not only for drunk drivers and safety belt violators but for all traffic violations.

With the record number of traffic fatalities (59) that occurred this January and February, officers will be stepping up their enforcement activity in hopes of slowing down that trend throughout the rest of the year. Of the 59 fatalities in the last two months, 30% or 17 were unbelted and

8 were identified as unknown.

Iowa's sTEP Coordinator Randy Hunefeld advised that all law enforcement agencies in the state will be proactive with their traffic safety efforts and constantly continue to educate and enforce traffic laws to change driver behavior.
