

## Designing for the Community's Future

"Resuscitating Columbus Junction" is almost here. As was reported in an earlier issue, design teams from "Keep Iowa Beautiful," "Keep America Beautiful," and RDG Consulting will be in town in early May to help construct a plan to position Columbus Junction's appearance for the future. The emphasis will be on giving suggestions to beautify areas of our community, with a special emphasis on the entryways. However, suggestions will also be made for Main Street buildings, the viaduct, and various public areas.

A preliminary team will be in town this Friday to lay the groundwork, but the full team will be here from May 6<sup>th</sup> through May 8<sup>th</sup>. The team has a full schedule prepared, but community input sessions are also set aside. On Wednesday, May 6<sup>th</sup>, residents are invited to participate in a working session at the Civic Center from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. On Thursday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, a working lunch at the Civic Center is scheduled from Noon to 1:30 p.m. where the public is invited to be a part of the process. At 5:00 p.m. on Thursday an "After-work" public review and workshop is scheduled. A final public presentation is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. on Friday, May 8<sup>th</sup>. Everyone in the community is invited to attend any or all of these sessions.

We are still in need of your suggestions. We were somewhat disappointed in the number of surveys that were returned to us, but we are still asking for input. Please, take a few minutes and write down any ideas you may have on a piece of paper. Make it into a list if it is easier. Ideas might include: downtown store

According to its mission statement, United Fund of Columbus Junction contributes to organizations and projects that serve Columbus Junction area residents and businesses by building a stronger community and improving lives. The organization disburses funds once annually. The current application should be used for activities that will take place between July 2009 and June 2010.

In the past year the board of directors of United Fund of Columbus Junction distributed over \$20,000 to 22 area groups. The United Fund of Columbus Junction was originally formed to help service organizations fund the valuable work they do for children, families and seniors in the Columbus Junction area. The United Fund serves as a central charitable fund that individuals and businesses donate to creating a pool of money that is distributed annually. The majority of contributions are made through payroll deductions, with Tyson employees being by far the largest donor group. Appliances will require a \$15.00 tag, which can be purchased at City Hall - No appliance will be taken without a tag. Separate Items such as: Metal, Appliance, and Furniture. We will not pick up: Tires, Batteries, Paint, Paint Cans, Hazardous Materials, Chemicals, Spray Cans, Windows or Any Glass Items. No Wood or Building Materials. Do not put anything in garbage bags - they will not be picked up. All items must be set out by 7:00 a.m., the day of clean up. This clean up day is for Columbus Junction Residents Only. ### Columbus City clean up day

Saturday, May 9, 2009 - Have all items at the curbside by 7:00 a.m. Saturday morning. There will be a \$15.00 charge for all appliances and a tag must be attached to all appliances. Those include refrigerators, stoves, freezers, microwaves, humidifiers, dehumidifiers, water heaters, air conditioners, and fluorescent light fixtures. We will not take: tires, batteries, paint/paint cans, hazardous materials, spray cans, wood/demolition materials, garbage/anything in garbage bags or yard waste. Tags can be bought at City Hall on Monday, April 27, 2009, and Monday, May 4, 2009, from 4-6 p.m.
