

## Improving the way of life in Louisa County

The Center was previously housed in temporary quarters near the Dollar General Store in town. After the 2008 flood officials began a search for a new location. Real estate was acquired in Columbus City, and despite a difficult winter, work progressed to last week's opening.

The Center provides a wide range of services, including medical and dental. Patients are eligible to receive services regardless of age, race, nationality, income, employment, health insurance or residence. Fees are based on patient's ability to pay. English/Spanish interpretative services are available.

Patients with Medicaid, HAWK-I, Illinois Health Connect and Medicare are encouraged to make the clinic their new medical and dental facility.

The clinic is open Monday through Friday, and appointments can be made by calling 319-728-7400.

Pictured in the lower photo, is the entrance area to the new assisted living facility adjacent to Colonial Manor, Colonial Heights.

Work has been progressing throughout the winter, and a possible July 1 opening is hoped for. The exterior is nearly complete, and painting is now being completed on the interior.

This will be the first assisted living facility in Louisa County, and will include living arrangements for nine individuals or couples. The facility has a common living room, library, kitchen and dining room. There will also be a beauty parlor in the facility. A corridor connecting the building to Colonial Manor is also available for residents who may wish to dine at the Manor.

These two new facilities exemplify the progress that continues to be made in making Louisa County a great place to live.

To schedule a time to donate, call UI Health Care Wapello at 319-523-8205. Walk-ins welcome! Donors who last gave blood on or before April 30, 2010 are eligible. Donors must be in general good health, be cold and flu symptom free for 5 days, weigh at least 110 lbs and bring a photo ID. Donors must be 17 years of age to donate, 16 with an approved UI DeGowin consent form. Blood donation is a safe and simple and only takes about 1 hour. The need for blood remains high during the summer months and it is especially critical to maintain an adequate blood supply before the long July 4th weekend. Each week the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics uses approximately 600 blood products. Blood collected by the UI DeGowin Blood Center is for use by patients at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics.
