Bare root tree seedlings available this season include Quaking Aspen, Pin Oak, Red Oak, White Swamp Oak, Hackberry, Sugar Maple, Black Walnut, White Pine, Red Cedar, Black Hills Spruce, and White Spruce. Shrubs available for purchase are Red Osier Dogwood, Rose

of Sharon, Rosa Rugosa, and Common Lilac. These trees and shrubs are sold in bundles of 10.

The SWCD is also offering high quality, local grown, bare-rooted Chi-

nese Chestnut trees. Other items available include native grass and forbs, tree shelters for your young trees, stakes, and tree mats.

Profits from the sales of trees and seeds go for conservation education, scholarships and promotion of natural resources in Louisa County.

Orders will be taken until Febru-
